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WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—In the Senate, Mr. Windom, of Missouri, introduced a bill, appropriating \$7,000 for the expenses of the Electoral Commission; referred to the Committee on Appropriations.
 Mr. Davis, of Massachusetts, introduced a bill to authorize and equip an expedition to the Arctic Seas; referred to the Committee on Naval Affairs.
 The Commission is in secret session, and it is stated that each member will file elaborate reasons for his vote which may prolong the session till to-morrow.
 The House Committee report that A. B. Lewis, of Louisiana; Republican Elector, resigned his office as Commissioner about November, 20th, 1876. Lewis tells a story about an attempt to bribe him to vote for Tilden.
 But little interest attaches to the Commission this morning. The best opinion still is, that the Commission will give the vote of Florida to Hayes.
 The House is reading bills to consume time. The proceedings are still credited to Thursday, Feb. 15th.
 Albert Peysor, Elector from West Virginia exhibited his naturalization papers.
 The Deficiency Appropriation Bill was passed and the House went into a committee as a whole on the private calendar business.
 The reports of the Louisiana Committee were submitted and ordered to be printed.
 The majority report declares that the Democratic Electors were elected in Louisiana, and denounces the action of the Returning Board as fraudulent and void, and the minority report declares that the Hayes Electors have been duly elected.
 The session was consumed in the discussion of the Railroad Sinking Fund.
 The Extradition Treaty with Spain was ratified.
 The Commission is still in secret session. Both Houses recessed to ten o'clock to-morrow.
 Full Cabinet. Charles Cavane was counsel before the Returning Board for the Democratic party, and testified that in the return from Vernon Parish, he saw the certificates from the Commissioners of the election, and they were received on the 2d of December by the Board from the Secretary of State, and were opened in witness presence. That Gov. Wells said turn them over to the Clerk, and that was all. No other member of the Board said anything about them. Knew that Lewis was United States Commissioner as late as Nov. 19th, and that Brewster was Surveyor General of the Land Office.
 The Commission decided not to remove secrecy till ten o'clock to-morrow. It seems to be understood that the Commission has decided to give the State to Hayes, but it is claimed that the conclusion was reached by two of the Republican members of the Court upon grounds fatal to the final success of their party. It is true that neither party is happy over the little that has transpired.
 Senator Mitchell says that a report published in a New York paper this morning, and in the Star this evening, purporting to give points of his report,
