

Important to Sheriffs.

There having been a difference of pinion as to whether or not a sheriff is entitled to compensation for a guard in conveying a less number than three convicts to the penitentiary, under chap. 107, laws of 1874-'75, Attorney General Kenan at the request of the Auditor has filed an opinion on this subject. The substance of the opinion is contained in the following:
