

The New Hampshire Election. Favorable Outlook for the Demo-crats—Nothing Decisive as Yet.

BOSTON, MASS, March 13 .- Reports from the principal towns in New Hampshire, at 1 o'clock, indicate nothing decisive as to the result of the election. Owing to the unfavorable weather, the vote is, as yet, tight. At Concord, in Wards 4 and 5, Mr Briggs (Rep) for Congress, runs considerably behind his ticket, and Mr Sulloway (Dem) is proportionately ahead. At Nashau the Democrats will probably elect a Mayor or a majority of the Aldermen. At Portsmouth the Republicans lock for an increased majority. At Claremont Mr Kent (Dem) for Congress, is ahead of his ticket: also at Kure. Nothing definite has been received from Frank Jones' District, except from Dover, which reports him as not running so far ahead of his ticket as at previous elections.


