WASHINGTON, March 19. The Secretary of War, Secretary of the Treasury, and the Attorney General, regard an extra session of Congress absolutely necessary.

The situation with regard to South Carolina and Louisiana is unchanged. The President stated to the last delegation of Southern leaders, urging him to immediate action, that it had required sixteen years to confirm the failure of the old policy, and that he should have at least sixteen days for inaugurating the new policy. My desire is to do the greatest good to the greatest number. To this end I shall always be glad to have your co-operation. I very much regret that I did not see you and shall baglad to do so at any time.

ACROSS THE WATER.

Fight Between the Turks and Russians----Probable Pacific Measures.

LONDON, March 19 .- A Reuter telegram from Zara says: A six hours obstinate fight took place between the Turks and the Bosnians on Saturday, between Bonaventura and Drezgnai; both sides suffered heavily. The Turks retired upon Livnor.

A dispatch from Berlin to the Times, says: The Russians appear to regard the protocol as a valuable concession obtained by Russia. Galas expresses the highest satisfaction at the success of the Russian settlement.

A dispatch from St Petersburg to the News, quotes Galas as declaring that peace may now be considered certain, as England has apparantly decided to sign a protocol, containing the principle of coercion.

A correspondent says: The object, of course, is to make the people believe Russia has gained a diplomatic victory, and adds: "Certainly the anarchy, now existing in Turkey, will seon force England to change her policy. Russia only has to wait, and the impossibility of abstaining from intervention in Turkey, will soon be manifest, even to Sardis, Beaconsfield and Derby. Unless the powers can bring the Porte to its senses, all the diplomatic fictions in the world will

not prevent war." Tho Manchester Guardian has special dispatch from Constantinople, dated March 17, which contains the following: "Popular feeling against Mahmond Mamad is gaining ground. Thirty saftas were arrested on Tuesday. The Minister of Police has been dismissed because he was insufficiently watchful. A large body of saftas went to the Police on Wednesday to demand the release of their comrades. Threatening revolutionary placards are increasing, and the people within the Palace are becoming anxious."

LONDON, March, 19 .- A special from uess will be reduced, if the clerical abuses bill is passed.

RICHMOND, Va., March 19 .- A fire this morning in Manchester, on the opposite side of the river from Richmond, destroyed six buildings in the business part of the city. The less is estimated about \$15,000.

GLOUCESTER, Mass., March 19 .- The schooner Christie Campbell, which arrived here Sunday, gunning from Genges Bank, reports having seen two topmast schooners capsized thirty miles off Cape Ann. It is not known

whether the crews were saved.

WHAT THE PRESIDENT SAID TO GENER-AL GORDON AND MR LAMAR.-The President then expressed in earnest terms his desire and purpose to bring about some satisfactory solution as soon as possible. He said that the difficulty had been at white-heat for sixteen years, and it ought not to be considered any great delay if it required sixteen days to get through with it in a satisfactory way. He expressed his belief that the problem was not so hard to solve as a great many persons sup-posed, but the number of offices now vacant in the United States (some six hundred) which must be immediately filled by appointment, were now occupying almost the entire attention of himself and the Cabinet, but just as soon as these appointments were made and the Senate had adjourned, he would at once take up the Southern question and solve it.

THE CLAIMS OF SOUTHERN MAIL CON-TRACTORS.-In the sundry civil bill, an appropriation of \$375,000 was made to pay the claims of the Southern mail Contractors, whose accounts were unadjusted at the breaking out of hostilities between the States. All the Contractors presenting claims will be required to make affidavit that they have not been paid by the Confederate Government, and then their statements will be carefully compared with the Confederate records for verification. The United States Government continued its mail service in such portions of the Confederate States as were accessible up to May 31, 1861, when all mail service under its direction was man of the Committee on Privileges formally discontinued in the eleven Confederate State. - Washington Special to Baltimore Sun.

THE NEW JUSTICE.—It is positively determined that ne nomination will be sent to the Senate during its present session to fill the vacancy on the Supreme Bench caused by the resignation of Justice Davis. The most influential recommendations from the South for this position are said to be about equally divided betwee Herschel V Jehnson and ex Senater Joshua Hill of Georgia, but it is as yet uncertain whether or not a a Southern man will be chosen. - Washington Special to Bal-
