DECISION CONCERNING SPECIAL TAX.

WASHINGTON, March 21.

Diligent inquiry is no more successful this morning than last night, in obtaining reports of yesterday's Cabinet proceedings...

WASHINGTON, March 21.

The Cabinet decided to send a commission to Louisiana. It is apprehended that the Coroner will be the most important witness.

A summons to answer for false imprisonment of Thomas Biggins, an alleged lunatic, was served on Gen Grant to-day.

The Agricultural Department gives notice that the issue of seeds for this season has closed.

Senator Christiancy will not have the Mexican mission. John Simms, (colored) appointed Steward at the White House, has given bonds for \$20,000.

The Chesapeake & Ohio Canal has been opened. The Cabinet, after deciding to send the commission to Louisiana...

The Cabinet, after deciding to send the commission to Louisiana, and maintain the status quo, adjourned to 5 o'clock, when South Carolina was considered.

Whether she shared the fate of Louisiana, has not yet transpired. The extra session of Congress will convene on Monday, June 4th.

The Supreme Court of the District decided that the certificates for a special improvement tax by the Board of Public Works, were issued with warrant of law.

The Cabinet adjourned without taking up South Carolina. The President is weary. The Cabinet may not re-assemble before Friday.

The decision to send a commission to Louisiana is definite, and was made without a division. It may be received as a unanimous acquiescence with, or submission to the President's views.

It is his policy. The composition of the commission is entirely conjectural, beyond Wheeler, who desires to be excused, on account of health, and Senator Davis, of Illinois, who pleads business.

No other persons have been mentioned by the President, and so far, the members of the Cabinet have not presumed to give their wishes voice.

THE EASTERN MUDDLE.

England Hesitating—The Course to be pursued if she signs the Protocol—Appointed Bishop for Florida—Breathed his Last—Advised to Keep Cool on the Eastern Question—Leipzig Adopted as Seat of Imperial Court.

LONDON, March 21.—The situation is unsatisfactory. The Post points out that if England signs the protocol, her first duty will be to ask the Porte to disarm.

A special dispatch from Rome to the News announces that Monsignor Nordi, Auditor of Sacred Rota is dying. ROME, March 21.—John Moore has been appointed Bishop for St Augustine, Fla.

LONDON, March 21.—The Pall Mall Gazette, after reviewing this morning's dispatches on the Eastern question, concludes as follows: "We invite our readers not to despair, but to suspend their hopes. It is safest to have no feelings of confidence yet awhile."

The Lancashire handicap was won by Footstep; second, Poursouvan; third, Lord of Lincoln. In the Reichstag to-day, the bill fixing Leipzig as the seat of the Imperial Court of Germany was adopted.

LOUISIANA.

A Negro Senator Deserts to Packard—Packardites Claim Both Houses.

NEW ORLEANS, March 21.—Senator Demas, colored, who has been acting with the Nicholls Legislature took his seat in the Packard Senate this morning, completing, it is claimed, a quorum in both Houses.

The city is very quiet. There has been no hostile demonstrations from any quarter. A conflict involving loss of life is now regarded improbable. The Nicholls police to-day arrested 4 more of Packard's recruiting officers.

GEORGIA.

A Murderer Lynched—He Confesses His Guilt.

AUGUSTA, March 21.—Edward Wells, the negro who murdered William O'Brien, in Burke county, was taken from the jail at Waynesboro last night and lynched, by a crowd of unknown men.

NEW YORK.

Nomination Rejected—Women to Hold Office.

ALBANY, N. Y., March 21.—The Senate rejected the nomination of General McClellan as Superintendent of Public Works. The Senate passed a bill allowing women to hold office on the school board.

UTAH.

The Mountain Meadow Massacre to be Avenged.

BEAVER CITY, UTAH, March 21.—Preparations are progressing for the execution of Lee, the Mormon, and leader of the Mountain Meadow massacre. Two companies of troops will be present.

INDIANA.

A Daring Robbery.

INDIANAPOLIS, March 21.—A man entered the National Bank, stepping on a box which he had carried in, reached over the counter, grabbed three thousand dollars and escaped.
