

WASHINGTON, March 30.

The Democrats are again allowing themselves to become hopeful. The hour and a half interview accorded Senator Bruce and Representative Lynch seems to have had for its object their reconcilement to the present loss to the Republicans of Louisiana and that this course would create new political combinations; that it would certainly lead to the early recovery of Mississippi and North Carolina, and eventually break the color line in all' the Southern States.


