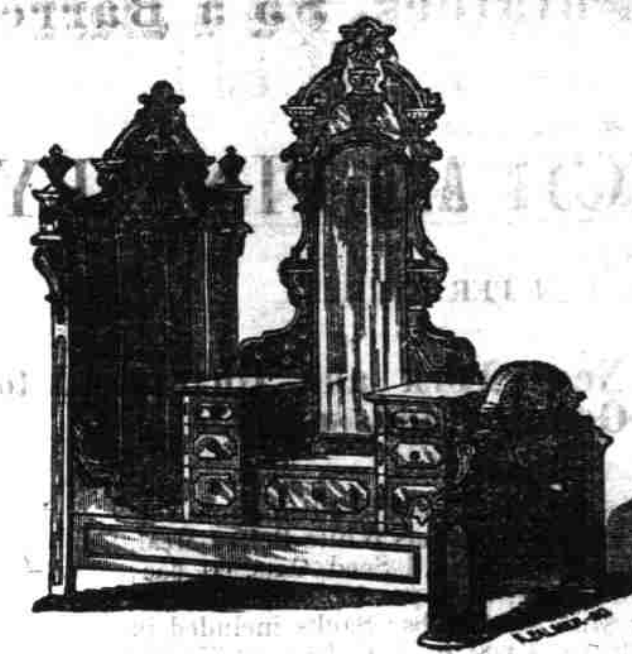

WASHINGTON I

Packard Maintaining a Bold Front.

A Packardite Proposition Accepted by the Democrats.

Hayes Writes, the Troops Shall be Removed.

A Law for Arresting the Packard Legislature.

Whiskey Rings to be Prosecuted.

Troops to be Withdrawn from New Orleans.

WASHINGTON, April 20.

The Herald's special says: Packard still maintains a bold front, and claims he has an abundance of reasons, means and friends to hold his ditch until the President is compelled to flood it.

The President telegraphed the Louisiana Commission to day, that in response to the request contained in Gov. Nicholls' letter the order for the withdrawal of the troops to their barracks, would be issued forthwith.

The signal officer at Barnegat, reports the brig, Magnus Pernambuco, from New York, loaded with sugar, ashore. The crew escaped in the life boat.

The Tribune's New Orleans special says: The Conservatives will wait until Saturday on as many as choose to come over, and then elect United States Senators, and adjourn: sundie.

All the members of the Cabinet were present at Washington to day. The President laid before them the telegraphic communication received from the Louisiana Commission, and much satisfaction was expressed with their tenor, which indicates an early adjustment of the political difficulties in that State.

Washington, April 20. W. M. Chandler, of Mississippi, has been appointed special agent of the postoffice.

A number of commissions have been signed for Northern postmasters. No Southern appointments are reported to day.

The Russian Grand Duke was visited by the Turkish Minister. Secretary Sherman has ordered the District Attorney to proceed in civil suits against the whiskey ringers who claim an immunity on account of states' evidence.

It can be stated on indisputed authority, that it was determined at the Cabinet session to day, that an order should be issued to withdraw the troops from the city of New Orleans to their barracks. The precise time when this order will be issued, is not made public. Its promulgation is looked for very shortly.

M. Schneider, of Chicago, has been appointed Minister to Switzerland. A. A. Freeman, of Brownsville, Tenn., has been appointed Assistant Attorney General for the Postoffice Department.

The State Department has advised that the American Consul imprisoned at Acapulco, has been released. EXECUTIVE MANSION, April 20.

LOUISIANA

Violent Demonstrations by Some Members—The Troops will not Remain.

New Orleans, April 20.—Commissioner McVeigh is quoted: "If there is any member of the Legislature who entertains the most lingering idea that the troops are going to remain, for God's sake disabuse him of that idea, for they are going to be removed."

Packard's Legislature in caucus issued another series of resolutions denunciatory of the Commission. The caucus was tempestuous.

Senator Young claimed he was restrained of his personal liberty. The guards on the stairs would not let him out.

Packard addressed the caucus, expressing his determination to resist to the end. A committee of colored ladies, headed by Mrs. Gov. Antoine, Mrs. Senator Burch, Mrs. James Lewis and Mrs. G. W. Brown, have united in an address to Packard, tendering sympathy to himself, and board and lodging to his legislature, and every attention to his sick.

The Nicholls Legislature have a returning board membership of 65 in the House, and 22 in the Senate.

THE EASTERN WAR. First Blood in the Conflict—Odessa to be Bombarded—Prince Charles Orders Mobilization.

London, April 20.—A bloody fight near Nicaria is reported. The early bombardment of Odessa is expected. The merchants are warned to remove their goods, as the custom house will be closed. The ships at Odessa are preparing to leave.

It was twelve months yesterday since the bank rate discount was fixed at two percent. Only once within thirty years, was so low a rate maintained so long, namely from July, 1867 to Nov. 1868.

A Reuters dispatch from Bagusa says: The Turkish troops divided into four corps are surrounding the Mixidite country. The inhabitants of several villages have laid down their arms.

Brownsville, April 20.—A decree of Prince Charles, issued to-day, orders the mobilization of the active and territorial armies, and their respective reserves. The militia and civic guards are also called out, and an extraordinary session of the Chambers summoned for April 28.

A special telegram to the second edition of the Times from Constantinople says Turkey is dismayed at the prospect of imminent war and would like to enter into a pacific arrangement, if it were not too late.

PENNSYLVANIA. Destroyed by Lightning. PHILADELPHIA, April 20.—Lightning destroyed a tank containing 22,000 lbs of oil. The burning oil fired another tank with 25,000 lbs, and running down the creek destroyed everything for a mile. The loss is very large.

NORTH CAROLINA

Light Ship Replaced at Frying Pan Shoals—Blowing a Gale.

Wilmington, April 20.—The Frying Pan Shoals light ship was replaced yesterday afternoon. Vessels on approaching the shoals should keep their leads going, as the light ship may drag, having lost her proper mooring in the recent gale. It is now temporarily moored with a small mushroom, and chain. It is now blowing a heavy gale from the Southwest, and she may already have dragged.

SOUTH CAROLINA

Hanged for Murder. Aiken, April 20.—Steve Anderson, a negro convicted of complicity in the murder of Baitman and Kaufman, Germans, in this county on the 2nd of last November were hung today in the presence of about 800 people, half of whom were negroes. No excitement.
