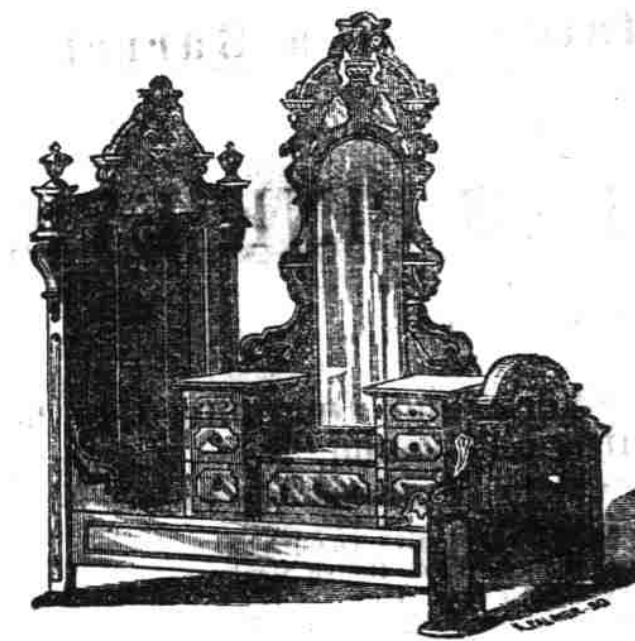

WASHINGTON!

What Hayes thinks of Blaine & Co.

HE DOES NOT FEAR THEM.

Report of the Louisiana Commission.

WASHINGTON, April 24.

Everts has gone to New York and Albany, and will be absent several days.

Grant and Chandler were out-riding together.

Hayes does not see how Wade, Blaine & Co., can give force to their opposition. He says they could not do it by thwarting any personal plans or prospects of his own, because he had none for them to thwart; and they could not do it by defeating his nominations in the Senate, because he never would send any name to the Senate, in whose confirmation he had any interest, beyond that inscribed by his general views as to the good of the public service.

Maj Stephens, Clerk of the Appropriation Committee of the House, while he has no doubt of an extra session being called, thinks it will dispose of its business in fifteen days after organization.

Two companies of soldiers are ordered from North Carolina, leaving only one company in the State, at Fort Johnson.

SOUTH CAROLINA.

The New Order of Things in the State.

Private dispatches received in this city yesterday from Columbia, say that there is no doubt but that the Legislature, which convened in that city yesterday, will confirm Gen M C Butler's title to the vacant Senatorship from South Carolina.

The Edgefield and Laurens Senators were sworn in, and the Senate now stands 15 Democrats to 18 Republicans, but one Republican votes with the Democrats, another is in jail, and the Senate is virtually tied.

Mr Simpson then took the seat and delivered a brief address, urging harmony and a strict regard for the rights and privileges of all classes.

LOUISIANA.

Louisiana Elects a United States Senator—Judge Spofford, an Unfinishing Democrat, the Fortunate Man.

NEW ORLEANS, April 24.—Gov Nichols has issued a proclamation requesting the citizens of New Orleans to attend to their regular business to-day.

As the Cathedral clock struck 12 to-day, a detachment of the 2nd Infantry under the command of Lieutenant Colonel R Bronke, marched out of the Orleans Hotel, passed up Charles street to St Louis street and out St Louis street to the river, where they embarked on a steamboat to their barracks.

THE EASTERN WAR.

War Gossip—The Czar's Review—Grand Duke's Proclamation to Roumania.

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 24.—An immense crowd witnessed the removal of the Russian insignia from the portal of the Embassy.

LONDON, April 24.—Gortchakoff's circular regrets that Russia finds herself under the necessity of proceeding single handed to realize the wishes of Europe.

When the Russians cross the Pruth, the Turks will send a large force of Circassians to destroy the Railroads.

The Austrian forces are sufficient to protect the Austrian interests.

The Russian army commences to march to Roumania Wednesday.

The Russian naval authorities have suspended navigation between the Crimea and Caucasasia.

Russia has promised Roumania independence and a royal title.

Turkey is bringing timber from Transylvania for bridges over the Danube.

There are only 7,000 Turkish troops in Crete, and the people are organized for an insurrection.

The Italian squadron which sailed from Taranto under sealed orders, is bound for Salonica.

The twenty thousand Russians concentrated on the Pruth will soon be ready to cross.

ST PETERSBURG, April 24.—A dispatch from Kischeneff, dated yesterday, and officially published to-day announces that at the review of troops by the Czar at Tiraspolimra yesterday, His Majesty addressing the officers said: "I felt grief at sending you to the field of battle, and therefore delayed action as long as possible, hesitating to shed your blood, but now that the honor of Russia is attacked, I am convinced you all, to the last man, know how to vindicate it. May God be with you; I wish you complete success. Farewell, until you return."

A formal declaration of war will be issued Wednesday.

The Czar's manifesto to the Russian army and the people, was promulgated to-day. The Emperor declares that in view of the rejection of the protocol and the obstinate refusal of the Porte to yield to the just demands of Europe, the moment has arrived for Russia to act independently.

BUCHAREST, April 24.—The Roumanian government in reply to the Turkish Grand Vizier's dispatch requesting the Prince to make arrangements with Abdul Kerim, Commander-in-Chief of the Turkish army, to prevent the passage of the Russian army, has declared that such step is too serious to be determined by Executive power alone.

The first Russian detachment, consisting of 40 sappers and an officer, crossed the Roumanian frontier yesterday, at Bestinak. One thousand men are expected to cross to-day.

Grand Duke Nicholas has issued a proclamation to the inhabitants of Roumania, opposing the passage of the Russian army under his command toward the Danube.

The Russians crossed the Roumanian frontier near Urgheni at 5 o'clock this morning.

In the House of Lords this evening, Earl Derby stated that 17,000 Russians crossed the frontier last night.

Count Schonvaloff, the Russian Ambassador in communicating the Russian circular to Lord Derby to-day, stated that a general order to cross the frontier had been given.

TENNESSEE.

Death by a Brutal Outrage.

CHATTANOOGA, April 24.—A daughter of Christian Peyer, five years old died from the effects of an outrage by a negro, who escaped.

OHIO.

Two Robbers Arrested

DAYTON, April 24.—Fritz Dine and William Harrison, the two principals in the recent diamond robbery at Nashville, were arrested, and half of the property was found on them.

GEORGIA.

A Colored Murderer Convicted.

SAVANNAH, April 24.—George Williams, colored, has been convicted of killing his step child by beating and roasting her. He was executed to-day at Springfield.
