

THE NEW ORLEANS NAVAL

HAYES' SOUTHERN POLICY TO BE DISCUSSED BY CONGRESS.

IMPORTANT TO ANTE-BELLUM MAIL COTRACTORS.

#### PUBLIC DEBT STATEMENT.

WASHINGTON, May 1.0 The most interesting contest is progressing over the New Orleans naval office. Pinchback and Antoine are the chief contestants, and may be said to represent the rivalry among the colored element. Senator Bruce, of Mississippi, is disposed to support Pinchback, on the ground that he is more legally the representative of the colored men of Louisiana, having fought their battles in a higher sphere than did his opponent. Antoine has has had State loaves. Pinchback has had national kicks. Gen. Chester's views, elaborated by himself, followed. Senator Burch has arrived.

Pinchback is expected to-night. The presence here of several prominent colored men from Louisiana, is to advise the appointments upon the basis of the President's Southern policy, and with a view to a more commendable and disseminating recognition of colored men.

Gen. Chester has the President's assurance that the colored people will have a just representation in the Custom House. Burch recommends ex-Lieut.-Gov. Antoine for the naval soil. office. Pinchback is likely to eppose this movement.

Chester is inclined to deprecate the removal of Baird without cause and will continue to advise with the authorities here what will best subserve the general government.

The debt statement shows a decrease of over four million dollars.

It is given out that the President desires Congress to fully discuss his Southern policy during the extra session. Without such thorough discussion, he fears that the Republicans of the North might labor under misapprehensions which might affect unfavorably the fall elections.

WASHINGTON, May 1. A circular issued from the Post Office Department directs that claims for ante-bellum Mail Contractors directs that applications must be made to the Second Assistant Postmaster.General, by the Contractor or his executive, as money cannot be paid to assignees. The application must show the charroute, how much in each State, if it policy, each power being intent upon extends over more than one, and the periods for which the claim was made. The evidence in writing or print, which claimant may have, must accompany the claim. The facts must be yerified by the testimony of two witnesses, who were postmasters on the route. If this is impossible, two other disinterested persons, who received mail at either of the terminal points on said route. The application and statements must be under oath. The credibility of persons making oath, must be certified by persons before whom that oath was made. Where the oath is made before a Justice of the Peace, his official character and signature must be certified to by the Clerk of the Court of Record, in county where the oath is made.

Nevertheless a Russian officer informs the correspondent, that Russia is fully prepared to sacrifice thirty thousand men in forcing the Danube, should circumstances compel immediate action in that direction.

LONDON, May 1 .- The Vienna correspondent of the Times telegraphs as follows; "As things look at present the British government will possibly may 2 be the only one to return a regular official answer to Russia's representation that she is acting in the interest and according to the wishes of Europe. The British answer may possibly indicate the limits within which England would not consider her interests threatened and would therefore remain neutral. The result of all this seems to be that for the moment at least, there is an end to anything like concert or acter and extent of service, length of even common ground of European

its own interests. Recruiting has been progressing briskly lately, nearly every regiment in the service is full. Military artificers at Woolwich were excused yesterday from regular monthly drill, on account of emergency. The work on which they engaged, namely, was the repair and preparation of the wagons and ambulances, consisting a field train. Seven 12 ton naval guns have been shipped to Portsmouth, and four hundred tons of ammunition and arms are being shipped for Malta.

VERSAILLES, May 1,-The French Chambers re-assembled to-day in Deputies. Dake De Cazes laying the yellow book on the table said: The pressent complications found France free from any engagement. Never, during the last seven years, had her relations with foreign States been better. The language of neighboring powers left no doubt of their pacific sentiments. In the Eastern question the most absolute neutrality is guaranteed. The most scrupulous abstention will remain the basis of our policy.

LONDON, May 1.-In the House of Lords this afternoon, Lord Derby in reply to a question by Earl Granville, said that the government had prepared an answer to the Russian circular which was approved by the Queen. It will be sent out to-night, and will be laid before the House as soon as delivered to Russia.
