

WASHINGTON, D. C. May 4. Turkey has positive assurance from Count Andrassy of Austria's pacific

The Porte has issued a circular de claring that Roumania by her convention with Russia is betraying the interests of the country and the confidence of the Sultan government.

The Porte henceforward considers Roumania ss in power of the enemy. as therefore all acts issuing during the Russian occupation are in usurpation of the Sultan's authority.

Roumanians have taken military possession of Kalafat. The garrison consists of 9,000 men, 40 Krupp guns About fifty shots exchanged between Ibrail and the Turkish gunboat was only a reconnoisance on the part of the

The Russians will certainly bridge the Danube near the mouth of the failure of the last Congress to pass the Pruth, and at Tuma, nearly opposite Nikapotes. A torpedo depot is established at the mouth of the Pruth. The torpedo corps consists of 600 engineers and sailors.

The Turks have determined to evac uate Daboudscha. The Turks are slowly falling back on the line of defence adopted by the council of war The alliance of Russia and Roumania is confirmed from all sides.

Iskendar Khan, nephew of the Amur of Afghanistan, started for Constantinople from London, last night, to offer his services to the Sultan.

London, May 4 -A dispatch from Berlin says the Turkish circular dated May 2d, was presented to this government yesterday, in reference to the Russo-Roumanian convention. The Porte pretests against the convention as an illegal act of the principality, facilitating invasion, and furthermore declares that the Prince authorizes Roumania to be in the power of a hostile, usurping government.

MANCHESTER, May 4.-A dispatch to the Guardian, dated Ragusa, May 2d, has the following: "The Montenegrins hold Duga pass, blockading Goranska Nicscis. Suleman Pasha, with 20,000 men, is advancing to relieve Goranska. Severe fighting is expected. It is stated that the Turks have persuaded 20,000 South Albanians to take up arms, on condition of Montenegro being given up to plunder. All the northern Albanian clans favor the Montenegrins.

The Turkish press law of 1865, has been suspended. Newspapers are now entirely under the administration con-

The Porte notified the representatives of the powers yesterday, that it had declared a blockade of the whole of the Russian Coast of the Black Sea. A delay of three days would be granted vessels wishing to enter, and five days those intending to leave the Black

A dispatch from Monkhtar Pasha dated April 30th, announces that the Russians have advanced in great force towards Kars, in a westerly direction, with the object of intercepting Turkish communication with Ezeroum. The Turkish commander leaving sufficient force at Kars, marched out with nine battallions, and occupied the village of Ichilakli, near Yardin, and west of Kars. A subsequent telegram from Monkhtar Pasha, dated May 1st, announces that some of the inhabitants of Kurshad, brought him reports that the Russians had attacked Kars, but were repulsed with heavy loss. According to a telegram from the Turkish commander at Batoum, the Russian military operations were arrested

the Assembly of Notables having decided upon the imposition of an extraordinary war tax of 480,000 pounds, the Khedive has telegraphed to Censtantineple that the Egyptian contingents now in Turkey, numbering 9,000 men, will be raised to 12,000. The remainder of the Egyptian centingents will be kept in Egypt for the protection of the Suez Canal.

WASHINGTON, May 4.

It was decided at a meeting of the Cabinet to-day, that the extra session of Congress, rendered desirable by the army appropriation bill, is net to be called to meet in June, but for October. This change of the original progromme was made upon a careful consideration of the general interests of the country; and also in compliance with the almost unanimous desire of the business community, as well as of members of Congress themselves, as far as they could be consulted, that there shall be no session of Congress this summer, if it could be avoided, and upon mature inquiry into all circumstances of the case, it was ascertained that without any immediate appropriation of money, the army can be clothed and supplied with all its necessaries, and that until the 15th of October, only one regular pay day has to be passed. It was also considered that if Congress meets in October, it may remain in continuous session, and finish its business before the next summer, so as to avoid the inconveniance of a hot session next year, as was this year. A proclamation, calling the extra session at October 15th, is to be
