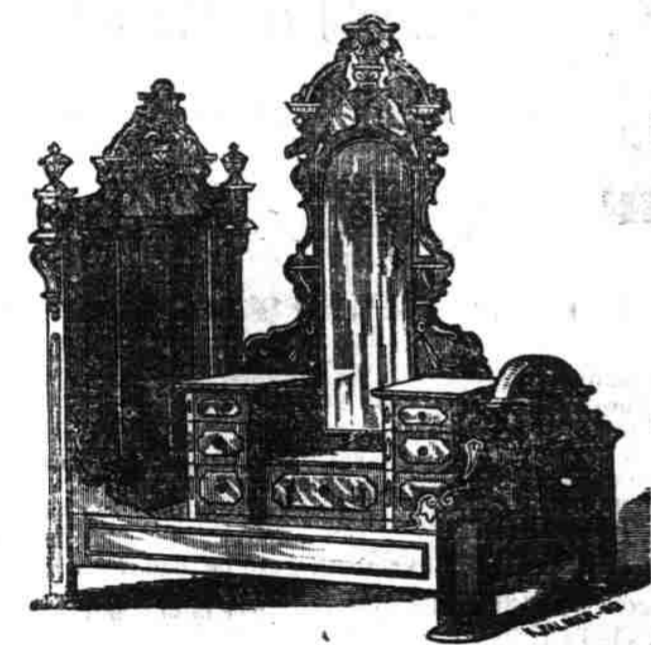

THE EASTERN WAR

Servia Will Remain Neutral.

Russians Attempting to Cross the Danube in Great Force.

Forced to Surrender by the Heavy Fire of a Battery.

Russians Gobbling up Turkish Stores Unrested.

The Russians Have Crossed the Danube.

War Items.

LONDON, May 15.—A Paris dispatch says M Lissips had a long interview with the Duc de Cassus, relative to the measures to be taken to secure the neutralization of the Suez Canal during the present war.

The Standard's Rome special telegraphs: I hear that all naval officers on leave have been recalled, and all army officers have been ordered to hold themselves in readiness to rejoin their commands.

A Times' Belgrade dispatch says: "The Russian Consul has declared in a special audience with Prince Milan, that Russia has notified Austria and England that Servia will observe neutrality, and that Russian troops will not enter Servia, she being excluded from the plan of operations."

VIENNA, May 15.—The Politische Correspondenz, which has semi-official letters from St Petersburg, says: "The Russian troops under Gen Kaufman will cross the Panier into the Widen in the event of England taking part in the Turkish War."

Grand Duke Nicholas and Prince Charles of Roumania, have had a meeting. The latter's position in the army is satisfactorily arranged. Nicholas arrives at Bucharest to-day.

The Czar by isolated action has succeeded from the alliance of the three Emperors, but is still bound to abstain from any action injurious to Germany or Austria.

Roumania has been notified that if she commences hostilities or declares her independence, she forfeits the protection given her by the treaty of Paris. The Telegraph's dispatch dated Match in Monday 14th inst., says: "The Russians are apparently making an attempt to cross the Danube. Heavy artillery firing has been going on up to the moment of my sending this dispatch. The Turks have so far been successful in repelling the attack. The Russians are believed to be in great force."

The Telegraph's Bucharest dispatch confirms the capture of the Turkish gunboat which tried to pass Kifiss. The correspondent says he has ascertained beyond doubt that the Servian authorities have accumulated large stores of forage and provisions at Gladava. The Turkish gunboat was forced to surrender near Kalaft, because of the heavy fire from a battery.

The News' special from Galatz says: Yesterday the steam tug from Ibrail took over some lighters and 200 laborers and removed several hundred tons of coal unopposed, which the Turks had accumulated at Gtchet for the use of their flotilla.

The Russian front will be covered by ten regiments of Cossacks.

The inundation has now decreased in the Birla Valley, and the troops are now marching down.

The News' Vienna correspondent says: The Russian army for actual operations now numbers nine corps only. Two are destined for Dabruedscha, and the main body according to military calculations, will cross near Giurgevo, and move Southeast towards Varna.

LONDON, May 15.—A Reuter Constantinople dispatch dated to-day, 4:30 A. M., says: News has been received that a Russian corps with cavalry and artillery crossed the Danube near Patback and entered the Dabruedscha. An engagement is proceeding.

MASSACHUSETTS.

Heavy Losses by Fire.

BOSTON, May 15.—A special to the Herald states that the losses by the fire at St Stephens New Brunswick last night was nearly \$500,000. About sixty-three tenements, eleven wharves and two schooners were burned. Among the heaviest losses are the New Brunswick & Canada Railroad Company's depot, machine shops, wharves and a number of engines and cars, all of which were destroyed. The Watson House and a number of other valuable buildings, with the ship "S E Chapman," were burned.

LATER.

A special dispatch from Morris Junction says the fire is spreading. The whole country is filled with dense smoke. Three villages are burned, and two persons missing.

WASHINGTON.

Office-Seekers Seeking Offices.—The Mexican Expedition Decried.—Georgians on their March.

WASHINGTON, May 15. United States Senator G Y Kelso has arrived, and aspires also to the New Orleans Naval office. Ex-Congressman Nash is supporting an outsider from his District for the place, whose name has not been made known.

Judge Dibble, of Kellogg's court, is in the field for the New Orleans Pension Agency.

The new expedition, to capture Senora, is laughed at by the filibustering element here.

The appointment clerks of the Treasury, Post Office and Justice Departments know nothing of any pending changes in any of the important offices.

The Georgia Republicans made it lively in front of the office the Assistant Secretary of the Treasury yesterday, by knocking each other down.

WASHINGTON, May 15. Richard Smith, of the Cincinnati Gazette, is a bidder for furnishing Postal Cards.

The State Department has information from the Consul General at Calcutta, that Capt Small, his sister, and chief officer Dyer and three steamen, of the American bark "Edmund Phinney," died of cholera at Akyab on the 25th of March. Cholera prevails dreadfully at Chittagang and along the coast and islands inundated by the great storm wave of October of '73.

NEW YORK.

The President at the Banquet of the Chamber of Commerce—He Addresses the Meeting—Received with Cheers and Great Applause—Destructive Fires—Russian Fleet Preparing to Leave.

NEW YORK, May 15.—At the annual banquet of the Chamber of Commerce, Hayes said:

MR PRESIDENT:—It is a gratification to have this opportunity to meet such an assembly of the business men of the city of New York. I wish to make my acknowledgments to them for their invitation to enjoy with them their annual social meeting. I wish to assure them that this hearty greeting is very welcome. [Cheers.] At peace with all nations of the world, and with an honest purpose on the part of our people and on the part of the government, [loud cheers] to strike for the ancient concord within our own limits, [hurrahs and great applause] I believe that, notwithstanding the unfortunate array of forces which have been distinguished, we may confidently look for early, decided and encouraging evidences of the reviving of business prosperity throughout our country.

It has been ascertained, beyond question, that invitations were sent to ex-Governor Tilden to attend the Chamber of Commerce; also Governor Robinson and all the leading officials of the State, but they all declined, lest their presence should seem an endorsement of the declaration of Mr Hayes' election.

No. 9, Gold street, occupied by the Hostettlers' Bitters Company, and C H Rutherford, Drug Manufacturer, was destroyed by fire to-day. The loss is estimated at \$50,000.

The Russian fleet shows signs of preparation for departure. ROCHESTER, May 15.—The Rochester Paper Companies' Factories, located at the Lower falls of this city, were destroyed by fire to-day. The loss is about \$100,000. They were insured for \$80,000.

UTAH.

Gentiles Alarmed.

SALT LAKE, May 15.—A dispatch says: "The arming and drilling of the Mormons continues throughout Utah. The Gentiles, and especially those in the northern and southern settlements, are alarmed at the few United States troops in Utah. Governor Emery has written a letter to the Secretary of War, requesting that Camp Douglas be provided with five companies of infantry and two of cavalry, and that Camp Cameron shall have two full companies."
