

He Unburdens Himself in the Presence of Kindred Spirits.

DES MOINEM, IOWA, June 27 .- Gov. Packard, last night, in response to a serenade, spoke as follows:

"KIND FRIENDS: I am gratified at this exhibitien of confidence and friendship to me.
