TELEGRAPHIC NEWS. WASHINGTON.

The Administration Wasn't Sure It was Right and Didn't Go Ahead in the Hyman Appointment—The Trial of Franks is for Effect—Dismissal of a Several Million Suit.

WASHINGTON, July 2.—The failure finally to appoint Hyman, the colored ex-member of Congress, as Collector of Internal Revenue of the second North Carolina district, looked upon as a serious indication that the administration is defective in the important respect of being sure you are right and going ahead. It is represented that the halting policy in this case has fractured the new party in North Carolina.

It has transpired that the Attorney General on March the 22nd ordered the dismissal of the suit brought against Jacob Thompson, of Mississippi, by Zach Chandler, then Secretary of the Interior, for several millions on the accounts of the Indian bonds.

Minister Noyes sails for Paris Saturday; Minister Lowell for Madrid on the 4th of July. Assistant Postmaster General Tyner has gone to New York.

Lawlessness in Kentucky. LOUISVILLE, July 2.—A dispatch from Mount Vernon says: "At midnight Saturday, nearly a hundred men attacked the house of Jos. Bithuman, a noted desperado. Bithuman would not surrender and firing upon the attacking party with a shot gun, killed Charles Burton. Though some fifty shots were fired at Bithuman, he escaped. The same party entered the Mount Vernon jail, and took there from Jas. Smith, Andrew Cummings, Kirk and Joe Gibbs, all charged with robbery. Removing these four a mile from town, they hung all of them. There is considerable excitement, but no outbreak is feared."

FLASHES FROM THE WIVES. The announcement of a general reduction of railroad wages at St. Louis caused quiet but deep feeling. The steamer, Red Wing, bound for St. Louis, burst her steam pipes, killing three and wounding several. Three men were beating above Niagara Falls, when the boat got into the rapids. Two jumped out and were drowned. The other remained in the boat and was rescued. Saturday night's storm in the West was very destructive. Its path seems to have been through the country in Indiana and Ohio, lying a little south of the centre of the States. A dozen fatalities are reported.

THE RUSSO-TURKISH WAR.

The Turks Have Abandoned Nikopolis—The Sultan has Little Chance of Aid from England—30,000 Russians Have Crossed the Danube.

LONDON, July 2.—The British Mediterranean fleet leaves Proterum bay under sealed orders. A German squadron has arrived at the port, it is said. A Shumla dispatch says: "A large Russian force advancing inland were repulsed at Ibrail."

Another dispatch dated 10.30 p. m. Sunday, says: "The Russian advance guard attacked Biela, but were driven back upon Sistova with heavy loss. A first battle is expected."

BERLIN, July 2.—The Russian government having ordered the purchase of thirty thousand horses in Germany, will in a few days issue a decree prohibiting the export of horses from the empire. It is semi-officially stated that this measure, if adopted, will be solely on the ground of internal economy, and not for political reasons.

PARIS, July 2.—The municipal council at Amiens was dissolved because it participated in a reception to M. Gambetta. It is expected that the municipal council of Amiens will share the same fate.
