Waddell's certificate for one year, owing to the loss of the steamship City of San Francisco, although it is represented that Capt. Waddell concedes such to be the case. Capt. Waddell, it is understood, proposes to move for a new trial as soon as the court of inquiry, consisting of the United States inspectors of boats and hulls, shall make their report to United States Surveyor Bemis. The grounds of his application will be prejudice on the part of his judges, one of whom is credited with having publicly expressed himself in an inimical manner in referring to Waddell previous to the holding of the court of inquiry."
