Philadelphia, July 27.—The police in breaking up a meeting, were stoned by a crowd of twenty-five hundred. Several shots were fired, and a desperate fight ensued.

Buffalo, July 27.—Passenger traffic on all roads except the Canada Southern has been resumed. Freight trains on the New York Central, Erie and Ontario and some minor lines are running on time.

St. Louis, July 27.—The citizens being finally armed, equipped and organized, commenced the attack on the depot. Companies with breech-loading guns took various positions. Gen. Noble with four hundred men under Capt. Silas Best, marched to the Union depot, which the rioters virtually held since Tuesday.
