

STATE NEWS.

MR. SUMNER AND PRESIDENT GRANT.—Some of the remarks attributed to Gen. Grant in the conversation recently held by him with a New York Herald representative at Edinburg have created intense astonishment here where the circumstances of which he speaks are so well known. Gen. Grant is reported to have said that he took no part in the displacement of Mr. Sumner from the chairmanship of the committee on foreign relations. It is strange that Gen. Grant should make such a statement as this when there are Senators now living whom both he and members of the cabinet personally solicited to take part in the movement degrading Mr. Sumner. There were not less than half dozen Senators who, in private, expressly excused themselves for voting against Mr. Sumner by stating that they did so because of their reluctance to offend President Grant. At the same time they admitted that it was a burning shame for Mr. Sumner to be so treated.—Washington Correspondence Baltimore Sun, 28th.
