WASHINGTON.

PROCEEDINGS OF CONGRESS.

The Resumption Bill the Leading Issue of the Day—It Passes the House—Full Text of the Bill.

The Committee Report in Favor of Kellogg—Mexican Troubles Again.

General News and Gossip.

WASHINGTON, Nov 23.—The argument in the Patterson habeas corpus case continues. Patterson is in attendance on the Republican Senatorial caucus which convened at noon.

The Senate Postoffice committee gave a further consideration to the case of Wickersham, the nominee for the Mobile postoffice, but reached no conclusion.

The House discussing the repeal of the resumption act. Mr Elyarts had an interview with the sub-committee of the House committee on Foreign Relations on the distribution of the awards of the American mixed commission.

A San Antonio, Texas, dispatch says that Gen Ord received, yesterday, an official copy of the order of President Diaz to Gen Daleon, commanding the Mexican forces on the border, to repel invasion by the United States troops by force, and Gen Trevino has been ordered to the Rio Grande with 2,500 troops to carry out the order.

The committee on Privileges and Elections voted 6 to 3 in favor of seating Kellogg. They have set Eustis' case for Monday, and have directed Butler and Corbin, from South Carolina, to prepare their cases forthwith.

NIGHT DISPATCHES.

HOUSE.—The great interest in the House to day was the bill to repeal the resumption act. There were fourteen amendments pending when the House began to vote, and all of them were negatived except one offered by Fort of Illinois, as a substitute, and which had actually been accepted by the committee on Banking and Currency.

"Amend the title so as to read: 'A bill to repeal all that part of the act approved January 14, 1875, known as the resumption act, which authorized the Secretary of the Treasury to dispose of United States bonds and redeem and cancel greenback currency.'"

There was a fire in the upper stories of a marble building, corner of 9th and Chestnut streets, Philadelphia, yesterday; loss, \$120,000.

Lloyd's telegram from Liverpool states that the steamer "Bohemian," from Boston, is ashore high and dry on Bristol bank. She is expected to come off with the tide.

THE WAR.

Strong Probability of England being Drawn into It—Consequent Excitement.

MANCHESTER, November 23.—The Guardian publishes the following from its London correspondent: "The recent success of the Russians in Asia, and the probability that they will soon achieve a decisive victory at Plevna, have brought back the government to that state of anxiety into which they were thrown by the first raid across the Balkans.

The feeling these events provoke in the minds of the ministers is to make war on the part of this country inevitable. Information of this declaration has been sent to the Russian headquarters, and has made a strong impression there. In these circumstances there is some reason for fearing this country may be dragged into the present conflict.

NOTE.—Excepting the statement that the Conservative organs clamor for intervention, which is corrected, the foregoing must be accepted with great reserve.

New York, November 23.—A dispatch from Harrisburg, Pa., says an indictment was found yesterday against DeWitt Ettinger, alias Glover, charged with wrecking the railroad train of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, on Saturday night.

A Rome dispatch says the Pope has suspended audiences on account of his sickness.

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Banks Closing Their Doors.

NEW YORK, Nov 23.—The stockholders of the Tenth National Bank have resolved to wind up. Reasons: The dullness of trade and the difficulty of procuring remunerative rates of discount on safe loans.

CHICAGO, Nov 23.—The Central National Bank has closed its doors, and will go into liquidation.
