TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

SPARKS FROM THE WIRES. Gleanings from the Old and New Worlds—News in a Nutshell. NEW YORK, Dec 22.—A morning paper announces that the famous mare, Flora Temple, known for many years as the Queen of the Turf, died at the farm of A. Welch, at Chestnut Hill, near Philadelphia, yesterday evening, at 7 o'clock; aged over 32.

LONDON, Dec 22.—Henry Finchback, architect and builder, at Manchester, has failed; liabilities, \$540,000. LONDON, Dec 22.—In consequence of the proposed reduction of wages, to take effect after the holidays, one thousand iron workers at Sheffield have ceased work.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec 22.—Judge Thayer, to-day, ordered that the writ of quo warranto against the Western Union Telegraph Company should be issued as suggested by the Attorney General, returnable the first Monday in Jan'y.

CHICAGO, Dec 22.—Dispatches received this morning at military headquarters, dated El Paso, December 22, say that all is quiet in that direction. Col Hatch had arrived and proceeded to San Elizarco with two companies of cavalry and one howitzer.

ELIAS GREENBAUM has filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy. Liabilities over \$300,000, of which \$125,000 is accommodation paper held by the city. The bankers are guaranteed by good men. The assets are about \$70,000, but his personal affairs are so mixed up with those of the firm and the banks, that the figures do not represent his condition.

BOSTON, Dec 22.—Operatives in the shoe shop of John Shaw, Sr. & Bro, at Lynn, Mass., numbering over 100, have struck, and disaffection exists in the other shops on an extensive scale.

NEW HAVEN, CONN, Dec 22.—Yesterday another policy holder applied to the probate court for the appointment of a trustee for the National Capital Insurance Company of Washington.

NEW YORK, Dec 22.—A San Antonio dispatch says it is stated on good authority that the United States troops will pursue the raiders on a fresh trail across the Rio Grande, when they cross at a point where there are no Mexican troops.

NEW YORK, Dec 22.—The case of Samuel J. Hilden, in the United States District Court, is postponed on application of the defendant's counsel to the 5th of January.

THE NEW MUSEUM of Natural History, in Central Park, was formally opened by President Hayes.

DISCUSSIONS as to the Possibilities of Peace—Speculations as to England's Position. LONDON, December 22.—The Times' Vienna special says negotiations have been proceeding some time concerning the neutralization of the Danube.

THE TIMES' correspondent at Athens is assured that many Cretan chiefs dissatisfied with the cautious policy of Greece, have adopted as their programme, freedom under the protection of England.

THE TIMES' Paris correspondent says a telegram from Constantinople announces that Sultan Pasha started for Adrianople Thursday.

LONDON, December 22.—A London dispatch to the Edinburgh Scotsman says: "In influential circles considerable credit is attached to the report that the government contemplates the purchase of the Port of Suez railway over Egypt."

THE MANCHESTER Examiner learns from a trustworthy source that a manufacturer of military stores, who had large orders on hand for both Russia and Turkey, has received notices cancelling both.

WASHINGTON NEWS AND GOSSIP.

WASHINGTON, Dec 22.—Senator Patterson has slightly improved, but is not yet out of danger. NIGHT DISPATCHES. WASHINGTON, Dec 22.—There is no outward improvement in Senator Patterson's condition to-day, except that he sleeps less disturbed and the pains in the region of his brain are not so acute.

THE EXECUTIVE party returns on Monday. Gen Robert Toombs is mentioned as a commissioner to the Paris Exposition.

THE PAPERS for the extradition of Joe Baggs Hopper are held at St John, N. B., prepared under the name of Miller. It is alleged that he swindled the Southern Life Insurance Company out of \$6,000, and afterwards victimized Jas G Bailie & Bro, of Augusta, Ga, at whose instance proceedings are progressing.

MR B G UNDERWOOD, receiving teller of the National Bank Redemption Agency, furnishes the following in relation to the new counterfeit five dollar note on the First National Bank of Hanover, Pennsylvania: All notes having the words "act approved June 3rd, 1864," in the lower border of the note are counterfeit.

NO MORE FIVES will be issued to the above bank, nor to the First National Bank of Tanawaga, Pa.

DESTRUCTIVE FIRE. Burning of Wharves and Freights in Baltimore—Richmond and York River Steamship Line the Greatest Loser. BALTIMORE, December 22.—A fire broke out at pier 2, corner of Pratt and Light streets, at the head of the Basin, this morning, on the wharves occupied by the Richmond and York River Steamboat Line, R. Foster, agent, and the Ericson Line (Philadelphia and Baltimore) J. A. Shriver, agent.

FIVE MEN HUNG. An Improved Court Tries Mexicans and Californians—Convicts and Hags Them. SAN FRANCISCO, December 22.—A few days ago the town of Caliente, in the southern portion of the State, was raided upon by a party of Mexicans and native Californians.

WATERY GRAVES. A Steamship Lost with All Her Crew. LIVERPOOL, Dec 22.—A conviction, which has been growing for several days, now almost amounts to a certainty that the Dutch steamer, "Friesland," from Java to Rotterdam, has been lost, with all hands, off Cape Finisterre.

THE BARCLAY STREET CATASTROPHE. Estimate of the Loss—The Explosion Still a Mystery. NEW YORK, Dec 22.—The loss by the Barclay street fire is \$418,000; insurance \$371,500.
