THE GREAT EASTERN QUESTION.

NEW YORK, Feb 1.—The Post's financial article says: "Thus far this has been the dulllest day of the year at the Stock Exchange. Prices are steady, the market prices of new fours being still below the treasury price. Gold opened at 14 and every sale since has been at that price. The general opinion is that with silver agitations satisfactorily ended, the premium on gold would speedily disappear, so strong are all commercial influences working in that direction.

NEW YORK, Feb 1.—The schooner Ella Haynes, supposed to be from Providence, with a cargo of salt, went ashore on Plum Island, in the sound, early yesterday morning, and, before assistance could reach her, sank with all on board. Capt Stephenson, of the schooner Chester, reports sighting the Haynes signalling for assistance, but being unable to reach her, owing to the heavy sea and the dangerous locality, bore away. Suddenly a high sea swept over the poop deck of the Haynes, which threw her on her beams end, and in a few moments she went to pieces and sank out of sight.
