

#### FROM ROME.

#### The Formation of the New Ministry.

LONDON, March 11 .- The Rome correspondent of the Times telegraphs : New Orleans, at which five or six millions a month could be coined at present. Making allowance for inter-ruptions, two and a half millions could inter-ruptions at the formation of a new ministry, is a former Garibaldian.
