### Sanitary Precautions.

Editor Charlotte Observer:—  
I read with a great deal of interest  
the letter of W. C. on "Sanitary Precau-  
tions in Villages," and endorse fully  
what he says. As strengthening the ad-  
mirable suggestions, I will cite an in-  
stance or two of the evil effects to cities,  
towns and villages of non-attention to  
privies and sinks, and what has been  
done in one instance, by proper atten-  
tion thereto. Before the late war the  
city of New Orleans was a hot-bed of  
disease, in which yellow fever was al-  
most annually epidemic, with period-  
ical invasions of cholera, typhoid fever,  
scourge, cholera. The general belief  
was that they were introduced from  
foreign ports. Ben Butler, with all of  
the persecutions that during the war,  
he inflicted upon that city, has left be-  
hind him a cause for gratitude. As  
commander of the department he feared  
the attack of yellow fever on his  
troops, saw that the quarantine of a  
strictly enforced by him, and that not per-  
mitting its appearance, and decided at  
once that the cause was in the city it-  
self. It, by its peculiar conformation,  
cannot be drained by a system of sewers,  
being between a river and a lake,  
nearly flat and at times below the level  
of the water in both river and lake.  
Hence everything in the shape of de-  
caying matter must be upon or above  
the surface. The privies were either  
surface or in cemented vaults or cham-  
bers above the surface. These filled the  
city day and night, with the most  
horrible odors. This he said was a cause  
of disease to be dreaded, and using his  
power as a military commander, he at  
once had the whole city cleaned and  
thoroughly deodorized and required it  
to be kept up. New Orleans was clear  
of yellow fever to the end of the war.  
From this experience, the Legisla-  
ture of Louisiana chartered a com-  
pany who keep the city privies and  
sinks thoroughly deodorized and clean-  
ed out, and use the material neutral-  
ized as manure, known as "Pondrette."  
The city is cleared of all bad odor, even  
while the material is removed at night,  
and the result is, that to-day New Or-  
leans is to its population the healthiest  
city on the continent. Since Butler's  
day, the city has only suffered once  
(1867) in fifteen years from yellow fever,  
and that before this company was char-  
tered. The disease was very mild and  
seldom fatal. On the contrary, Vicks-  
burg and Memphis, both distant from  
seaports, 400 and 800 miles, situated  
on high commanding bluffs, with fine  
natural drainage, lying far north of yel-  
low fever latitudes, have been scourged  
repeatedly by both fever and cholera.  
(vide the epidemics of 1865, '66,  
'67 and '73), owing entirely to want of  
attention to drainage and surface or pit  
privies, the fecal matter being left to  
throw off its poison into the atmosphere.  
The writer has frequently found it un-  
bearable in both cities, and always pre-  
ceding an epidemic. These cities will  
continue to be scourged until the cause  
is removed.  
Charlotte possesses every natural ele-  
ment to make it a healthy city, having  
a high location and fine surface and  
sub-drainage in every direction which  
the various railroad cuts have very  
much improved. It has now a fine  
reputation for health and to preserve  
it during the heat of the coming sum-  
mer, it is only necessary to follow the  
judicious advice of "W. C." to keep  
the city in perfect health and make  
that reputation permanent. The vari-  
ous railroad stations in the city furnish  
a vast amount of charcoal in the clean-  
ings of the engine furnaces and the  
surface of the earth and inextinguish-  
ible supply of dust, which may be either  
dried or soaked, and will answer all  
the purposes required for deodoriz-  
ing. This will not be sufficient, how-  
ever, the matter, after being neutralized,  
must be removed.  
Experience teaches that advice, how-  
ever good, avails little unless applied  
or enforced. It also shows that to be  
applied it must be by force in this  
case, and the city authorities should  
confer a lasting benefit by enacting  
and enforcing their sanitary efforts.
