FRESH CABBAGE, AT THE CASH STORE, June 17

THE LIBERIAN COLONISTS who left Charleston last April on the ship Azor arrived about a month ago at Sierra Leone, a British colony on the west coast of Africa. The dispatches elsewhere printed on the subject tell a horrible story of mismanagement and consequent suffering on board, all of which might have been prevented by the exercise of the most ordinary precaution. Twenty-five of the unfortunate immigrants died on the voyage, and the only surprise is that a larger number were not sacrificed by the neglect of the promoters of the expedition. In the first place, before the vessel had left port, measles had broken out on board, and before she had been nearly a week at sea ship fever prostrated nearly all who had not been prostrated by the other disease. To add to the horrors of the situation, the supply of water ran short and there was no physician on board worth the name. The captain, it is said, did all in his power to mitigate the sufferings of the unlucky voyagers, but in the absence of a good doctor he could do but little. That an expedition of this character should have been sent on a journey of so many thousand miles in a vessel in such a condition is simply disgraceful. It argues gross ignorance, if not culpable neglect, on the part of its promoters. The brave immigrants deserved a better fate.
