The Raleigh News says that Hon Wm T Dortch, of Wayne, consents to the use of his name for the State Senate from the district composed of Greene and Wayne. Mr Dortch was twenty years ago prominent in the politics of the State, was Speaker of the House in 1860, and later a Senator from North Carolina in the Senate of the Confederate States.

The River and Harbor and Sunday Civil Bills Ransom's Popularity, denoval

Washington Cor Norfolk Lankmark, 14 Senator Mat Ransom submitted the following smendment to the river and barbor bill in the Senate: "That the sum of twenty thousand dollars is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise provided for, for the purpose of having a complete survey and examination of all the water lines and routes leading or that may lead from the harbor of Norfolk to the Atlantic Ocean south of Hatterss, including any communication that may be practicable with

the Cape Fear river; and the said examination and survey shall embrace the line known as the Dismal Swamp line and the line known as the Albemarle and Chesapeake Canal line, and all other routes and lines that may be racticable in the waters of Eastern North Carolina connecting Norfolk har-bor by inland navigation with the ocean south of Cape Hatterss."

The amendment was agreed to—ayes,

35; noes, 6. Senator Ransom also had an item put into the bill, when it came from the House, for a beacon-light in Edenton harbor, Afbemarle Sound, N. C.,

To-morrow, when the sundry civil expenses bill comes up Senator Ransom will offer the following amendoment, and I feel quite confident he will be able to "put It though" the Senate: "For beacon-lights in North Landing river, Currituck Sound and North river, North Carolina, on the line of Atlantic inland navigation, twenty thousand dollars."

The above appropriations are as important to Norfolk as the Old North portant to Norfolk as the Old North State, and the "City by the Sea" owes the Senator a hearty vote of thanks. Subsequent to the passage of the foregoing item in the bill, the Two-Cent Senator from California (Sargent) sneeringly said he was in favor of seeing how large a bill they could make now. "A Senator (meaning Gen Ransom) rises have and on his passage nouvelerity here and on his personal popularity puts in \$20,000, and because Senators do not like to vote against him the amendment is carried." Two-Cent Sargent never uttered a truer thing. Gen Ransom is the most popular Senator in the chamber.
