We have schooled ourselves always to rejoice when the laudable efforts of a neighbor have been crowned with success, and we delight in nothing more than in encouraging our neighbors in the prosecution of enterprises that are calculated to benefit the projectors and redound to the good of the people at large. Feeling thus, we can truthfully say that we have watched, with no small degree of interest, the progress of a movement, inaugurated one year ago, by the State of North Carolina, that looks to the professional training of the public school teachers of the State and those who contemplate adopting the profession of teacher. The experiment was tegun last year at Chapel Hill—the seat of the State University. The normal school opened in June and was continued a month or six weeks. Over two hundred teachers, ladies and gentlemen, were present. Six weeks. Over two hundred teachers, Iadies and gentlemen, were present. The State had provided an annual appropriation of \$2,000, and this was supplemented by the general agent of the Peabody Education Fund, in the sum of \$500. The able, special teachers—Profs Ladd and Owens—were employed. They were assisted by the University professors and prominent teachers from various portions of the State. The leading idea was to impart instruction in the best methods of teaching and of governing. This was thoroughly done, and especial attention was given to the "three R's." A desire for green fields and pastures new was sought to be created by a course of lectures on general topics by distinguished jurists and scientists. The results were of the most gratifying character. The school was re-opened on the 18th instant, under the most flettering supplies. By the 21st inst character. It is believed that the number will reach four hundred. One must be dull, indeed, who fails to see the great good that must needs accrue to the educational interests of North Carolina from this Normal School at Chapel Hill. We wish that every Southern State could be induced to follow in the foot steps of the 'Old North State' in thus providing for the development of teaching force in those to whose care "the chil-
