During the past week there has been a marked awakening in Baltimore jobbing trade circles, and preparations for the fall trade have commenced in earnest somewhat earlier than usual. Ample stocks of goods have been secured o meet the demands of customers, and orders also were in some lines freely filled for Georgia, the Carolina and Virginia merchants. The near-by interior demand is fair for the season, and careful inquiries show that a good fall trade is assured at steadier prices than for some time past. The mercantile houses, as a rule, started their salesmen out earlier this season than usual, and have had nearly uniform good reports from them. It may be mentioned in this connection that a Baltimore street, wholesale boot and those house yesterday shipped nearly three hundred cases of goods to thir-teen States, Michigan, Kansas and Georgia representing the extreme points of shipment.


