The National Democratic Committee-Tilden and Anti-Tilden Disputants-The Defeat of Representative Waddell, of North Carolina.

[Special to the Baltimore Sun.] THE NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC COMMIT-

Vashington, November 7.—Recentintimations have been thrown out in public places here, of serious dissatisfaction with regard to the management of the affairs of the national Democratic committee, by Senator Barnum, the chairman. It is alleged that when Mr. Hewitt resigned the chairmanship of the committee Mr. Barnum was elected in his place at a meeting here when not more than a half dozen members of the committee were present. No exception, it is affirmed, would have been taken to this rather irregular proceeding had Senator Barnum acted, according to the views of many, for the benefit of the national party, without respect to his personal affiliation or the interests real or supposed, of individuals. Mr. Barnum is the warm personal adherent of Tilden, which has also made him ob-noxious to those Democrats who are hostile to that gentleman. It is asserted by those who assume to know that Mr. Barnum's efforts during the campaign were confined almost exclusively to the election of members of the Connecticut Legislature with a view to his own return as Senator, and that he showed but little practical interest in the election of Democratic members of Congress anywhere else. These are matters which are freely talked of in Democratic circles, whether based upon facts or not. As chairman of the national committee Mr. Barnum had it in his power to delay the next meeting of the property of the property of the property of the power to delay the next meeting of the property of the committee for some time, and it is possible that by the time the next meeting does take place the dissatisfaction which now exists may be appeared.— Possible, but not probable, for it is almost inevitable that a struggle between the Tilden and the anti-Tilden elements will occur when the committee does meet for business. ORDINANCE: The Board of Aldermen of the city of Charlotte, do ordain, that any person desiring to exercise the office or calling of drummer or soliciting agent for any person or partnership, residing or doing business within the limits of the city, for the sale of merchandise, goods, wares or articles of traffic, shall first apply to the City Clerk for a license, for which license he shall pay two hundred and fifty dollars! (\$250). Any person violating the providollars. (\$250). Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a penalty of fifty dollars, for each and every offense, to be collected as other fines and penalties."
