[Washington Special to Louisville Courier-Journal, 14th.] The National Republican gazettes the President to-day as a convert to the bloody-shirt policy of the stalwart Republicans. It is evident that the people of the South are to be subjected to a new ordeal of persecution. Every falsehood that perjured carpet-baggers and worthless negroes can invent is to be made the pretext of invoking and prostituting the machinery of the Federal courts. It is boastfully announced by Republicans that two hundred prosecutions have already been ordered, and more are to follow, with packed juries and such judges as Bond. It is expected that enough convictions can be secured to propitiate the extreme Radical element, and possibly goad Southerners to acts of resistance which would be made the pretext for fresh persecutions. It is intimated that if any district-attorney shall be found too decent and upright to engage zealously in this vile work, he will be removed to make room for one far less scrupulous.
