The Price of Fertilizers. As the question of the price of guanos is one which is now agitating the farmers in this region, the follow-ing will be of interest, as it presents the matter in a new phase; it is from the last issue of the Augusta Chronicle and Constitutionalist:

"It will be recollected that the convention of fertilizer manufacturers and dealers, which recently met in Augusta. adopted a resolution to the effect that five hundred pounds of middling cotton, delivered at the planter's depot in a merchantable condition, was a fair price for a ton of standard ammoniated guano at the coast. The action led to meetings of planters all over the coun-

try, at which resolutions were adopted. declaring that the farmers would not purchase guano at that price. We learn that the manufacturers and dealers have lately receded from the position taken at the Augusta convention, and will take five hundred pounds of middling cotton for a ton of standard ammoniated guano delivered at the plan-ter's depot, instead of at the coast, and four hundred poinds of middling cot-ton for a ton of acid phosphate, at the planter's depot. We were informed resterday, by a large dealer in this city, that he had sold more guano this season than last, and had made a greater number of cash sales."


