
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

Half the wonders of the celebrated mica mines have never been told. The Clarissa, the principal mine, is now being worked by a force of forty or fifty hands, two hundred and sixty feet under the surface of the ground, and the supply of mica still appears to be inex-haustible. There are evidences, too, that this mine was worked ages ago. Upon the sides of the deep shafts, now caved in, are the stumps of what were huge forest trees, which seem to have died from sheer old age. Mining instruments, too, have been found unlike any met with elsewhere. A party of distinguished scientists visited this mine some years since, and after an examination of all the evidences of its antiquity, came to the conclusion that it must have been worked by a pre-historic race several thousands years ago. The interior of the mine has a very novel and striking appearance. The light from the lamps shining on the exposed blocks of mica gives them the appearance of mirrors of various shapes and sizes, set in the solid granite walls. The blocks of mica when first removed from the mine present some interesting phenomena. Pictures of flowers and vines, in the most fantastic shapes and gorgeous colors, arrange themselves over its surface. Breathe upon them, and they will disappear, being superseded by beautiful circles representing in their coloring every shade of the rainbow. These phenomena are doubtless to be attributed to the action of gasses confined in the mica in coming in contract with other gasses.
