





Board of Dental Examiners

The Board of Examiners appointed by the North Carolina Dental Association under the law enacted 7th day of March, 1879, will meet in the city of Raleigh on Monday, the 21st day of May, 1880. All persons bolding temporary certificates, and those wishing to commence the practice of Dental Surgery without a diploma, are hereby notified to appear if that time for examination.

All persons who have commenced the practice of Dentistry since the 7th of March, 1870, with out a diploma or certificate, are doing so in direct violation of the law, and are liable to the penalties thereof.
