THE UNIT RULE. What Garfield Thinks its Fate Will be.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—In conversation yesterday evening, Gen. Garfield spoke quite freely his opinions about the unit instructions given by some State conventions.

He says State conventions have a right to instruct delegates at large, because they are the direct representatives of conventions that appoint them.

District delegates are the creatures of the districts and not of the convention, and should be left to obey the voice of the people of their respective districts, or when that is not well defined to follow their own individual judgment.

A State convention has no right to instruct them how they shall vote. This idea of States instructing district delegates to vote as a unit is, he says, the old Confederate plan, and is based on the theory that the State is sovereign.
