THE CONVENTION PICTURED.

Scenes in the Hall—Appointment of Committees—Work of the First Day. CINCINNATI, June 22.—The sultry heat of last night mastered the music and enthusiasm of the Democracy at an early hour, and drove thousands of the most ardent of the party to the hills about Cincinnati.

SCENES IN MUSIC HALL.

Before 11 o'clock the streets were brilliant with delegations and clubs and ringing with the music of many bands, each ambitious to exhibit their zeal for their respective candidates, and the cars heading for Music Hall were jammed with delegates and spectators.

APPEARANCE OF THE DELEGATIONS. The delegations dropped in sluggishly, most of them mopping their faces, swinging their fans and apparently indulging in regretful reflections upon the hot stage that was before them.

THE NEW YORK DELEGATES.

The New York delegates were last to enter the hall, and there was a buzz throughout the hall as they filed in.

THE SOUTHERN MEN. Across the aisle from New York Col. Breckenridge sits in command of the chivalrous sons of Kentucky. His handsome features are as fresh as when he fought Tilden's battle at St. Louis four years ago, but his whiskers and hair have had many silver threads woven in them since then.

THE HALL CROWDED. At half-past 12 o'clock six thousand people were crowded into the hall and there was not a vacant seat from parquette to dome. The spectacle was not so grand as that of Chicago, where ten delegates and attendants were comfortably seated, but the general appearance of the body was most creditable and imposing.
