POLITICAL NOTES.

Senator Conkling, in responding to an invitation from the chairman of the Pennsylvania Republican committee, writes: "Whether I shall be able to attend myself in meeting the Republicans of Pennsylvania this year depends upon how soon I can dispose of matters which must receive attention before I can go into the canvass. Just now I cannot foresee whether I shall be able to leave this State."

The Hancock Veteran Association of Lancaster, Pa., numbering 180 members, had a meeting Tuesday evening. A number of members of the Grand Army of the Republic signed the roll. A resolution was passed denouncing the Hartranft circular, now being secretly distributed among the members of the Grand Army of the Republic.

The joint debate between Messrs. Landers and Porter, the Democratic and Republican gubernatorial candidates in Indiana, has been decided. Hon. W. H. English, chairman of the Democratic State committee, named the place in each of the thirteen congressional districts for the discussion, and the Republicans accepted it. Mr. Porter sent the challenge.

Before the nominations were made at Cincinnati, the Indianapolis Journal, Republican, said: "There is no doubt that the Democratic party in Indiana a better politician, better organizer, or a man possessing more of the qualities of real statesmanship than Wm. H. English."

His practical, often homespun illustrations, are always admirable, and he is in rapport with his audience from the first word to the last. His fun was inimitable, his wit sparkling, his occasional outbursts of passion and eloquence animating and pleasing. It was in the true sense of the word a great speech, full of versatility and common sense and truth and political wisdom. The crowd, hot as it was, would have been content to have sat and stood two hours longer and with empty stomachs.

Col. D. K. Melton's introduction of Gov. Vance was extremely happy. It could not have been better possible. It was a gem—sparkling with wit and flowing with pleasant. We shall jot down some notes of Wednesday night's speaking hereafter. We do not think any one will accuse us of exaggerating in anything we have said.
