What the New York Bulletin That State will determine the presidential election. Chairman Barium is hopeful.

Republicans carrying the State, he says, is absurd. Reviewing the situation of last Saturday, he said—

"I have examined carefully the figures presented from all sources, and am positive that the Republican claim has no foundation in fact. The State Democratic committee have made a careful canvass of the entire State north of the Harlem Valley, and have reports showing a large increase—over 20 per cent.—over the Democratic majority of 1876. The lowest Democratic estimate that I have seen, made by a person who is extremely cautious and generally too low in his figures, gives the following result: Majorities in Democratic counties, 69,200; net Democratic majority, 24,750. This allows for a falling off of the Democratic majorities in Chemung, Columbia, Green, Hamilton, Lewis, Monroe, Niagara, Orange, Otsego, Queens, Rensselaer, Richmond, Rockland and the other Democratic counties of the interior, and only an increase of 6,000 majority in the city of New York in the face of an increased registry of 34,000. Looking at these figures coolly, comparing them with the results in 1876, bearing in mind that the Democracy is absolutely united throughout the State in national, State and municipal nominations, it is impossible to conceive of any foundation except audacity for the Republican claim. In face of the fact that notwithstanding the distractions, divisions and indifference of last year, the vote of Robinson and Kelly combined showed a large Democratic preponderance. It is absurd to argue that the Republicans can carry the State in this year of union and enthusiasm?"

Trial Resumed. NEW YORK, Nov. 1.—Examination of Kenward Philp, charged with malicious libel upon James A. Garfield, was resumed before Judge Davis this morning.
