WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—It is stated

on authority very close to Mr. Blaine

himself that it is a mistake to suppose

that Gen. Garfield has offered his

Secretaryship of State or any other

cabinet position. This agrees with

Gen. Garfield's own statement on the eve of his

departure from Washington, that he had

made no offers of cabinet positions to

any one. Mr. Blaine has expressed to

several of his intimates his opinion

in favor of his own proposition to put

Gen. Grant back on the regular roll of

the army, but has intimated that he will

favor a proposition to put him on the

retired list.

GEORGIA'S VOTE.

Senator Hill, of Georgia, is reported

as expressing the opinion that the elec-

toral vote of Georgia will be counted,

notwithstanding the failure of the elec-

tors to meet on the day provided by the

law of the United States. His opinion

is based on the fact that the conflict

of the State code with the constitutional

provision was unintentional, and that

there will be no serious opposition to

the vote because of technicality. Sen-

while on the other hand it is known

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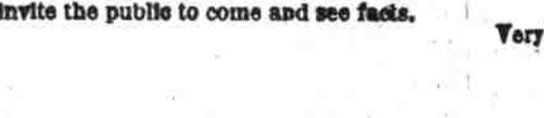

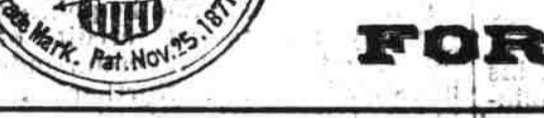
