NEWS IN NORTH CAROLINA.

Gatherings From the State Papers.

Greensboro Patriot: Twenty-eight persons bought tickets for Indiana, Kansas and the "Lone Star State" at the office of the Richmond and Danville Railway Company...

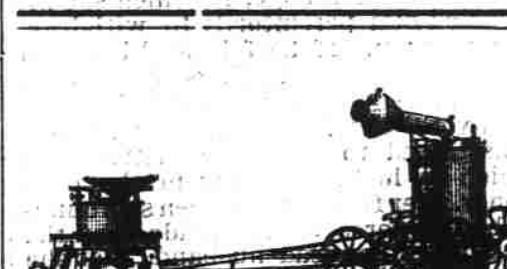

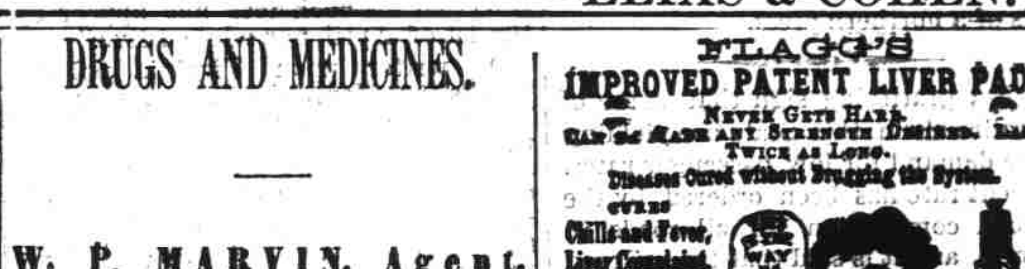
