Hundred Thousand Candle-Power. Cleveland (Ohio) Leader.

On Tuesday an electric light of 100,-000 candle illuminating power was successfully tested at the Brush works in this city. This light is 50 times the magnitude of an ordinary electric lamp. such as is used for street-lighting pur-poses. It is the largest light ever produced by human hands. The light was built to order for use in the British navy. It is intended to be used in night attacks and to scan the sea for the approach of torpedoes. dis rather curious, when we remember that the decade between 1860-70 was during four years a period of de-vastating war, in which over half a million men lost their lives from wounds and camp diseases, that the census returns for 1880 should show a larger disproportion between the sexes than those of 1870. In 1870 the proportion was 97,801 females to 100,000 males, In 1880 the proportion was 96,519 females to 100,000 males. The distribution of 100,000 males. tribution of sexes under this last census is 25,520,582 males to 24,632,284 females —an excess of males amounting to 888,-298, or 1.77 per cent. of the whole. It is not easy to explain this increase in the disproportion of the sexes unless upon the supposition that it proceeds from the increase of immigration during the latter part of the decade just past. In Maryland the sexes are very nearly equally balanced. By the census of 1870 there were 102,838 females in the State to each 100,000 males, while by the census of 1880 this disparity has been reduced to 102,300 females to 100,000 males. According to the last census Maryland's population consists of 462,004 males to 472,628 females, an excess of the latter sex of only 10,624, or 1.18 per cent. The District of Columbia shows the largest excess of females of any portion of the country the pro-

of any portion of the country, the proportion being 112,501 to 100,000 males, while Rhode Island, with all its factories and female operatives, shows only 107,864 females to 100,000 males. 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
