THE ZERO-MOTOR.

Steam Possibly to be Superseeded by Ammonia and Water.

WASHINGTON, April 15.—There is at the navy yard here an apparatus known as the Gangee ice machine.

The primary idea of the inventor was to secure a machine for the economical manufacture of ice, and he constructed a compound-ammoniacal engine,

Chief Engineer Isherwood, of the Navy Department, was detailed to investigate the machine, and he made a report to Secretary Hunt, in which he stated that the scheme had an entirely practical look about it, and he doubted not but that if but a short time should be allowed Gangee he would produce a motor capable of furnishing power

Professor Gangee exhibited his drawings and explained all the details, and when the President, with a critical and mechanical eye, desired to know the use of some mysterious looking tubes, which extended about the engine, it was shown that the tubes were for the joints and bearings; the aqueous fluid being used for lubricating purposes instead of oil, which becomes heated.

To the ordinary reader a scientific explanation of the details would be bewildering and is therefore unnecessary. The only ingredients for generating the gas were liquid ammonia and pure water from a hydrant near the machine shop.

No attempt has been made as yet to utilize the power for motive purposes, but the inventor asserts that he will be able to run steamships and cars and machinery without the use of coal, and that the day for boilers is fast approaching an end.

When Kater first started, it was claimed that his engine was an amputated one, but he disproved this by drawing off the water and allowing it to be tested. The present engine shows forty-four horse-power, requires the services of one man, consumes water and a small quantity of ammonia.

The power of expansion and contraction possessed by ammonia has already been applied—the aid of other mechanism than Professor Gangee's—to the running of light machinery, but whether it is a practical motor in actual use or not is a matter for future experiment.

VIRGINIA AND FLORIDA.

The Plans that are Being Laid in Washington.

Delegations of Republicans from Virginia and Florida were at the White House to-day. The Florida Republicans talked in a very pretty strain to the President on the prospect of rescuing Florida from the hands of the "Bourbon" Democracy, which according to their ideas could be made certain and sure if the President would only give the offices to them individually.

The President made the usual stereotyped answer, that he would consider what they said. The Virginia delegation was headed by Representative Jorgenson. These gentlemen spoke generally in behalf of the regular Republican party in Virginia and appealed to the President in earnest and eloquent language not to cripple his own party by giving any aid or countenance to the repudiation faction of Manone and Riddleberger.

The President listened attentively, but refrained from any decided expression of opinion, except as to his hope that the cause of Republicanism in the South would increase. He said that all that had been said interested him and would receive the fullest consideration, as he regarded the whole subject as of great importance.

An Agricultural Building Cheap.

Yesterday the National Hotel was purchased by the State of North Carolina, the sum paid being \$18,000. Fab H. Busbee, Esq., represented the State in the transaction.

The hotel building will afford besides, rooms for the committees of the General assembly, and the geologists and the museum, and for the laboratory of the chemist, Dr. Dabney, who will, we learn, shortly remove to this city.

There will be, besides, ample room for the accommodation of the Supreme Court, and probably the State library, whenever it shall be deemed advisable to transfer them from their present cramped quarters in the capitol.

The executive committee, Governor Jarvis, and Messrs. Battle and Holt, demonstrated their excellent business capacity by their prompt action in this purchase. The opportunity for such a bargain does not often occur, and should not be missed.
