

Mr. Disston was perfectly willing that the land of the company named should have the right of way provided that the land doingted to it should be compensated for its line grant of an additional tract chewhere of citial value and extent from the State to the parties. The necessary papers were duly signed by the parties in interest.

Small Pox in Mitchell County.


