The coroner was notified and gave a permit for the removal of the body.

The deed was committed at 2 o'clock in the afternoon. He lingered in an unconscious state till six o'clock when he breathed his last, surrounded by many of his friends and the members of his family. The motive for the act, which is given by his friends, is that it was the result of mental derangement, brought on by years of suffering from epileptic fits. No other reason could be given as his financial affairs were said to be in the most prosperous condition.


