Minister Lowell to inform the British government with regard to their arrest that an accused person shall, immediately upon arrest, be informed of the specific crime or offense upon which he is held, and that he shall be offered an opportunity for a speedy trial before an impartial court and jury, which are essential to every criminal prosecution...

To this direct instruction, which if properly maintained, would have speedily released these men, Minister Lowell replied by suggesting to this government that the Secretary of State should forward the trial or release of the imprisoned men by questioning the right of the English arbitrary law, "so long," as Mr. Lowell's own words, "as Lord Russell's message to the British government provided that all Englishmen in this country were presented with the same condition. How the British lion would growl and stamp around and exercise all his faculties of body and mind if he had except for the fact that others had stood by him. The American eagle had been aroused from her ignoble slumber, and the British lion must quail before her. It was said that the men in prison would get their liberty providing they pledged their honor not to return to England. Could there be any ignominious vagabond in this country with a drop of American blood in his veins, whether he had risen to the position of Secretary of State or any other place of dignity in this government, who would get down on his knees and subscribe to such a disgraceful condition as that? [Cheers.] He might himself conform to that condition, but he would not permit any other Englishman to do so.
