A great deal has been said recently about the increase in cotton spinning in the South, but those who have not kept posted will be astonished at the actual figures.

Estimating the cost at \$27 per spindle it costs an investment of \$9,763,200 in machinery of \$9,763,200, at which, adding 25 per cent. for operating capital, gives a total investment in these new enterprises of \$12,214,000.

These spindles, being all proportioned for spinning coarse numbers of yarns where the average production will be eight ounces per spindle, or above, the consumption of cotton will equal one hundred and twenty thousand bales of cotton per annum, and a corresponding production of goods. On the line numbers spun by Eastern mills, where the average production per spindle is below three ounces, it will require one million spindles there, to equal the amount above.

A NEGRO RAILROAD.

A North Carolina Negro Wants to Build, Man and Own a Road with Negroes. Philadelphia Press.

An interesting story was related to a Press reporter last evening by Special Attorney-General William W. Ker, who returned from a trip through the Carolinas.

The negro, who was a genuine, coal-black African, of good address and manly bearing, appeared to be about forty-five years of age. His name is E. F. Martin. He said that he was born a slave, and was owned by the great Georgia rebel, Vance.

The negro accordingly went to Atlanta, where he worked on the Confederate fortifications, taking there the name of E. F. Martin. He then tramped northward, worked through the Union line, and was engaged at Sherman's headquarters as a guide.

Martin's mail route ran east from Wilmington about seven miles, to Wrightsville, and then south along the coast of Albemarle Sound. He soon became convinced that this country was a good one for a negro to take a road, and that such an enterprise would pay well.

The next step was to build the road, and now Martin is endeavoring to take a philanthropic shape. He planned to make the road a distinctively negro enterprise. He would build it with colored labor and colored capital, and man the train with colored conductors, brakemen and engineers.

"I offer to all men who desire an interest in this enterprise the privilege of obtaining stock in the road for labor or material, as follows: For twenty-five days' labor or for \$25 worth of material furnished, one share of stock will be issued. For every five days of labor, he will be given \$25 in money and also a share in the road worth \$25.

THE POOR MAN'S CHANCE. "I offer to all men who desire an interest in this enterprise the privilege of obtaining stock in the road for labor or material, as follows: For twenty-five days' labor or for \$25 worth of material furnished, one share of stock will be issued.

THE ONE OBSTACLE. Mr. Ker, on the train: "I have put all my money into this, but I can't build the road alone. I believe that if I succeed, and I know I shall succeed, that I shall have done the work of a lifetime in a few days."

Dredging Our Gold-Bearing Rivers. Atlanta, Ga. We learn that the huge dredging-boat, equipped for the purpose of mining the heads of the Chesapeake and other gold-bearing rivers in North Georgia, is at work on a large section of the coast, and by building a line from Wrightsville north to Norfolk, Va., there would be a complete coast line, with two markets, Norfolk and Wilmington.
