TENNESSEE DEMOCRATIC CON-VENTION.

Gen. Bate Nominated for Governor. NASHVILLE, June 22 .- The Democratic State convention assembled at 2 p m yesterday and consumed the afternoon in discussing the majority report from the committee on resolutions.
