

SCOVILLE TO HIS WIFE. On May 4 Scoville wrote to his wife from Chicago as fellows: "You have proved yourself even more ungrateful, more heartless, more utterly deprayed than either of your brothers, and that is saying a great deal. I am going vigorously to attack the three Guiteans, and those that are not hung will wish they had been. Your infernal brother at Washington and the like infernal one at New York shall peither receive any quarter. They shall go down with yourself and Bolinand Harper, Johnson and Early. I have the lightning shafts nearly ready to strike, and no power shall stay my hand. I have asked, begged, entreated for my wife. They have defrauded me of her, ruined her and mock at my

calamity. In this letter Sceville entreats his wife to return to him, and signs himself "Your loving husband."
"To-day John W. Guiteau received a litter from Scoville, expressing great solicitude about his daughter Bertha. Of his wife he says: "I do not seek to interfere with the conduct or move-ments of Mrs. Scoville. We all here charitably say she is insane. That is the only theory on which her conduct towards me can be accounted for except the one of "devilish depravity," and she and you can take your choice. So far as I have heard, there is no difference of opinion among our own acquaintances on the subject. All pity her as "off" when they would other-wise condemn her as bad. The proba-bility is you will have the pleasure of supporting her, being the nearest relative and sympathizing with her fully. If she does not take her life upon the execution of her worthy brother she

will be sent to an insane asylum if she returns here." In view of the threatening character of the letters from which the foregoing extracts have been made, it is Mr. Jnb. W. 
