Reducing Taxation the Leading Topic --- Rev. Mr. Richardson and Mr. Brewster --- The Axe Again --- Person-

Correspondence of the Charlotte Observer. WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.- There is an increase of the talk mentioned in this correspondence of righteous plans for reducing taxation. The rebuked Republicans never tire of telling the interviewer how this Congress means to do the right thing by the people, and in no demagogue spirit. But there are good reasons for believing that more will be said than done. In the first place, what remains in the Republican party, chiefly in the West and the city of New York, of the free trade element cannot bear the Kelly proposition to abolish the internal revenue. Very many of the more practicable sort hold that protection only protects when duties are reasonably high, and that its prime objects are defeated when the tariff, by absolutely prohibit-

ing importation, so cuts off revenue as keep at least a part of the internal tax, for fear that the attempt to raise all necessary revenue out of imports would cause such a reduction in duties as to seriously interfers with the earnings of American monopoly. 




