THE LOST ST. LOUIS GIRL. Mary Churchill Traced to the Laundry of an Indiana Insane Asylum. St. Louis, November 4.—Thomas J. Gallagher, sporting editor of the Globe-Democrat, who has been working on the Mary Churchill case for months past, finally located the girl yesterday in an insane asylum three miles from Indianapolis, Ind., where she had been working in the laundry since September 4, under the name of Jennie Lockwood.

MASSACHUSETTS. BOSTON, Nov. 6.—Sixty-one towns, including Lynn, Lowell, Fall River, Lauretown, Newberry, Port and Fitchburg, give Robinson 56,875 and Butler 23,379. Lowell gives Butler a majority of 1,092 against 1,587 majority for Robinson. The Joint City Convention of the Legislature, the House, Delegates and half of the Senate have to be elected. This legislature reappoints the State for congressional representation, and elects most of the heads of the State departments. The new senators will also vote in the next election of U. S. senator.

REPORT ON INTERNAL REVENUE. WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—The annual report of Commissioner of Internal Revenue Evans shows that the consolidation of revenue districts will save \$125,000 annually to the government. The estimated reduction from the abolition of taxation on objects exempted by recent legislation is \$43,000,000 per annum. The increased revenue from distilled spirits will, however, make the aggregate internal revenue receipts for the current year at least \$126,000,000, as compared with \$114,563,344 for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1883.

MURDER, ROBBERY AND OUTRAGE. CHICAGO, Nov. 6.—A special from Chihuahua, Mexico, states that Jacob Kipp, a wealthy resident of Milwaukee Wis., while on his way from the central terminus at Laredo to Durango was robbed of \$80,000 and murdered by road agents. His wife was outraged.

A LONG STRIKE ENDED. CHICAGO, ILL., Nov. 6.—A dispatch from LaSalle, Ill., to the daily News, says the coal miners strike which began on July 1st terminated this morning 400 men returning to work. Strikers had demanded that mine owners should discharge their nonunion men but this was not done.
