TUSCALOOSA, Ala., Nov. 18.—At the meeting to-day of the river and harbor convention the following resolution was adopted: "Resolved, That this convention heartily favors liberal appropriations by Congress for the improvement of rivers and harbors in all parts of the United States, and recommends to our Senators and representatives in Congress that they should act as a unit and urge upon Congress the importance of making appropriations adequate for the completion within a reasonable time of the improvements recommended by this convention, with a view to the speedy enjoyment by the people of the States and the general government of the advantages to be derived therefrom.
