CENTRAL AMERICA.

E ir y in March last war broke out in Central America, caused by the attempt of Guatemala to consolidate the several States into one government. In these contests between our neigh boring States, the United States for bore to interfere actively, but lent the aid of their friendly offices in deprecation of war, and to promote peace and concord among the belligerents, and by such counsel contributed importantly to the restoration of trans quility in that locality,

The emergencies growing out of the civil war in the United States of Columbia, demanded of the government at the beginning of this administration, the employment of an armed force to fulfill its guarantees under the thirty-fifty article of the treaty of 1846, in order to keep the transit open across the isthmus of Panama Desirous of exercising only the powers expressly reserved to us by treaty, and mindful of the rights of Oolumbia, the forces sent to the isthmus were instructed to confine their action to "positively and efficaciously" preventing the transit and its accessories from being "interrupted or embarrassed." The execution of this delicate and responsible task necessarily involved a police control where the local authority was temporarily pow erless, but always in aid of the sovereignty of Columbia.
