

MR. CLEVELAND'S ANCESTRY llandsome Susanna Porter and an Episcopal Bishop, His Great-Grandparents.

The Buffalo (N. Y.) Courier yesters day printed an interesting chapter on the ancestry of President Cleveland, written by an Episcopal bishop, who traces his ancestry to the same source. The bishop refuses to give his name to the public. He says:

"President Cleveland comes of the old colonial stock, and inherits through Susana Porter an interesting claim to be regarded as connecting the presidency with the historic days of the founders of Massachusetts. This lady was born March 1, 1716 and was the daughter of Aaren Pro-

ter, paster of Medford, Mass. Her mother was Susan, daughter of Ma-jor Stephen Sewall, of Salem, whose brother was the Judge Sewall in whose court, I regret to say, the Salem witches were tried and cruelly condemned. This worthy was grand-iather of Susanna Porcer, and her paternal grandiather, Samuel Porter, seems to have been one of the founders of Hoadley.

Her light and possibled forchead, her aquitine nose, oright and beautiful black eyes, small and lovely mouth had each its poher time, and some of the richest and most respectable men of the neighboring towns were suitors for her hand, when she gave her heart to a gay young collegian whom her harms had attracted to her side, and who, with a fine physique and handsome face, and with a spirit as noble and a humor keen, had easily supplanted his older and more wealthy rivals. His name was Aaron Cleve-and After completing the necessary studies preparatory to entering the munstry, be was elected pastor of the small town of Haddam, Conn., and thither he went with his beau,i. ful wife in 1739. This must have been a great trust to the lady, for she was the barling of the family, as well as all her acquaintances, and had

been accu tomed all her life to ease and luxury:

"Mr. Cityeland, whom she so improvided ly preferred, was a schelar and a gentleman, and it is a my tery how he became so poor, for his lather are a positive seathly was one of the wealthiest fr cholders in Medford, where he was known as Captain Cleveland. He sold his Medford property and bought 600 acres for £3,000 in Connecticut, near East Haddam, in 1739. He gove his other sons valuable farms in this region, and we must conclude he count ed the education at Harvard an equivalent gift to his son Aaron. At this time the preaching of Whitfield had powerfully interested Mr. Cleveland, who was a natural orator him self, and he adopted a more earnest manner in the pulpit. Dissatisfaction followed among some of his people, though the majority adhered to him with ardeut attachment. He was accused of departing from Calvanistic orthodoxy, and so, in 1747, went back to the vicinity of Medford as pastor of Malden, South precinct. ed the education at Harvard an

as pastor of Malden, South precinct.
After a time, however, he left Malden and removed to Halifax. Nova in his views, for at Halifax he pro-cessed the faith of the Church of legland, and there being at that time no bishop in America, he went to

England to take orders.
"Vhen Mr. Cleveland arrived in "Vhen Mr. Cleveland arrived in Philatelphia he went to the house of Dr. tenjamin Franklin, whose friendship and respect he enjoyed. He was appointed rector of New Castle, in Delaware. The people became deeply attached to him, but he was forced b go to Philadelphia for medical treatment, and died there, under Dr. Franklin's roof, August 11, 1757, at the age of 36 years. His widow, with her ten children, received a moderate pension from the English Church, and returned to her relatives in Salem. Although the Bishop does not say so, he means to be understood that the President's grandfather was a son of Susanna Porter."

Savannah News.

The dredge Tomochichi has been at work for some time dredging at the wharf of the Propeller Towboat Company across the river and opposite Drayton street, preparatory to driving piles and repairing the wharf. The dredge daturday struck an ancient wreck, supposed to be that of an old war ship. There is every evidence that the vessel was strongly built. The timbers are of oak. The wood brought up by the dredge is in a fine state of preservation, being as sound as when first put into the vessel. The dredge brought up numbers of old bayonets and gun locks, rusted and almost destroyed by age. The wreck is burled deep in the mud. From the appearance of the stuff brought up from the wreck it is evident that the vessel belonged to the last century. It is said that during the revolutionary war a 74-gun British ship chased a Scanish war sloop into this harbor, and that the crew scuttled the sloop to prevent her capture, but at what part of the river she was sunk was never definitely settled. At the time she was supposed to have considerable money on board, as was usual with Spanish war vessels at that time. About fifty years ago a company was formed in Philadelphia and New York, and parties came out here for the purpose of finding the wreck and recovering the money supposed to have been sunk with her, but whether they ever succeeded in finding the wreck is certainly that of an old war vessel. 


