

IN MUKDEN SINCE MONDAY.

Kuropatkin's Whereabouts-Troops Take Positions Around the City-Critical Stage Past.

St. Petersburg, Sept. 7, 5:35 p. m.-The lk of the Russian Manchurian army s near Mukden, where it now appears General Kuropatkin has been since Monday. His troops, it is understood, are not entering the city, but are taking up prepared positions around Mukden. While there is no specific information in this point, the general staff believes that only a small rear guard is in the aborhood of Yentai. No further ng of importance is expected south of Mukden. 
